


# Norfolk: Weston in James Woodforde's time

## scale

from Weston parsonage (3) to Weston House (4) is 2 miles, as the crow flies  
from Weston Church (1) to Hockering parsonage (8) is 2½ miles, as the crow flies

<sup>1</sup> map Bryant's map, published in London, was printed in monotone (black and white). A rare cased, hand-coloured version of his map has long belonged to the Cozens-Hardy family of north Norfolk, with whose permission this extract is reproduced.

The blocks of colour represent the hundred (an area of civil administration). Weston and Ringland are in Eynsford hundred (orange). Hockering lies in Mitford hundred (pink). Attlebridge and Taverham are in Taverham hundred (pale green).

Parks and plantations, such as the grounds of Weston House and Weston parsonage, are shown in dark green.
